

Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation and Board of Education

With the adoption of the new Cedar Catholic Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation, Cedar is transitioning from the Priest as President to the Lay President model. This change also moves the present advisory school board to a board of limited jurisdiction under the direction of the Archbishop of Omaha.

The board of education continues to choose seven members from the four Parishes along with the addition of three Catholic Development Blue-Ribbon members. This ten member board is required to meet a minimum of six times per year. Board Committees are also required to meet between board meetings to conduct committee work and support progress on the strategic plan. Cedar Catholics' depends upon three main revenue sources: parish subsidies, tuition, and funding through Catholic Development efforts. One function of an annual report is to acknowledge and thank benefactors' support through cash gifts, fundraising,, and interest earned from endowment fund gifts given. Catholic Development also provided East & West Catholic and Holy Trinity Elementary Schools with \$90,000 budget assistance each for 2024, besides offering tuition assistance and other support gifts. With budget assistance, Catholic Development provides funds for special projects, tuition scholarships, technology, campaigns, academic programs, and teacher/staff Christmas bonus/gifts.



Recent Programs and New Class Opportunities

Robotics and Investment Clubs

In 2021, after several years of friendship with the Catholic Development Office, Marilyn Sudbeck (Class of 1966) and her husband, David Fickel of Broomfield, CO, gave the gift of financial support for robotics and investment programs to Cedar Catholic students.



Over the past five years, the Robotics Club grew under the direction of Mr. Lowell Brown. Upon his retirement, the program now has new leadership under the direction of Mr. Rick Perk. Mr. Perk taught at Cedar Catholic from 1975 to 1984. After leaving Hartington, he continued to teach in high schools prior to accepting a position at the University of Nebraska as the Director of the Center for Advanced Land Management Information Technologies (Remote Sensing, GIS and Robotics) from 1996 to 2020. Mr. Perk brings a wealth of experience and commitment to this program.

Due to schedule conflicts, the Robotics program is offered as a club activity to all interested students for opportunity to be involved. The program continues to grow, thank you to David Fickel who continues to fund the Robotics Club, even after his wife Marilyn's passing. With David and Marilyn's generosity, Cedar students will also have the opportunity to work with our

local investment advisors to invest in the actual market with funds that were provided to the Investment Club in January 2022. Marilyn's commitment to students learning to invest with real dollars instead of virtual investments to realize the full effect of market gains or losses will be

In addition to students learning financial knowledge, the Nebraska Legislature passed the K-12 Nebraska Financial Literacy Act. In response, Security Bank currently provides an elementary financial literacy program. Students in middle and high school are required to take Intro to Business and Personal Finance classes to meet these standards.

New Classes at Cedar Catholic

Cedar Catholic added two new, seventh—twelfth grade classes for the 2024-2025 school year.

Family and Consumer Science (FCS): As a result of parent/community input in our strategic planning process, Cedar

Catholic is offering two Family and Consumer Science (FCS) classes; many years ago known as Home Economics. The kitchens on third floor were completely remodeled (except for the traditional, durable flooring) due to the generosity of Roger and Sherry Wortmann. In addition, the Development Office coordinated a gift shower for the kitchen equipment, utensils, and supplies, and sewing machines. The current FCS classes are a half day, junior and senior high school program with an enrollment of 78 students.

Art Classes: After a number of years of a coop art program with Hartington-Newcastle Schools, Cedar Catholic was also able to hire a half time art teacher. This program also came as a result of parent/ community input in the 2024-2027 Strategic Plan. The 2024-2025 Art Classes have an enrollment of 55 middle and high school Students, developing natural and new talents.

Approximately ten percent of our 2024 graduates received the Regents Scholarship from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, Omaha, or Kearney. These are prestigious awards given to only a few and includes full tuition while there. Annika Kuehn received the RHOP Scholarship from Wayne State College with full tuition, guaranteeing her Admittance to the University of Nebraska Medical Center after she completes studies at WSC.
